## An ounce of prevention.....

The flowers are starting to bloom, as is our 2024 RVing season. Before you know it, we will all be waking up the RVs from their winter's nap and scurrying from rally to rally. I don't wake up and scurry like I used to and find it prudent to prepare before I attempt to scurry. Let's all take a pause and make certain our RVs are properly prepared before we hit the road. We all have our check-lists. Please make certain your list includes the following:


- 1. Check the tires for proper inflation, visible damage and age. They're the only thing separating you from the hard highway.
- 2. Have a propane leak test performed on your unit.
- 3. Verify smoke detectors, propane detectors and CO detectors are operating, have fresh batteries and are less than five years old.
- Remove the fire extinguisher(s) from their brackets, check the charge, turn it upside down, shake it several times and secure it back in the bracket. One extinguisher is NOT enough. Make sure you have one in the kitchen, one in the sleeping area, one outside and one in your tow or towed vehicle.
- 5. Have your batteries checked.
- 6. Operate, clean and lube your emergency exit(s).
- 7. Exercise your generator for two hours with at least a 50% load.
- 8. Clean or replace you air conditioner filters.
- 9. Sanitize your water system.
- 10. Flush your water heater.
- 11. Clean and dress your slide seals.
- 12. Have a roof inspection and cleaning performed.

My goal is to keep us all as safe, happy, efficient and frugal as possible. If you have any ideas for educational subjects throughout the year. Please send me a note and I will try to put something together. We need some new topics.

Looking forward to seeing everyone soon.




